Abstract

Contrary to popular belief, the University of Phoenix and other for-profit providers represent only a small fraction of online education. Concerns About MOOCs

All online education is provided by large for profit universities

• This is a complete misconception as over 70% of online education is offered by nonprofit providers

MOOCs are unengaging as few people finish

- Many people that start a MOOC do not finish, but they likely had no intention to
- People can take the course to pass or simply explore the topic

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Findings (cont.)

- Further learn about topics taught to them in school

Online master's degree programs provide

- An unmatched opportunity for mid-career professionals to get education
- A way to get education without leaving one's job or family

Those geographically isolated from education benefit

- From access to education they previously did not have
- From learning skills that help them become integrate into society
